What is the LCAP?

A three-year district-level plan that describes the goals, actions, services, and expenditures, to support positive student outcomes and addresses State and local priorities.





How are we funded?

What is the Local Control Funding Formula (LCFF)?







Base Grants

Every student generates a base grant which funds basic educational costs, such as: employee salaries, building costs, and instructional materials.

Supplemental Grants

Low income, English learners, and foster youth/homeless, generate more funding above the base grant (20%).

Funding is to increase and improve services for the specified groups above to improve achievement.

Concentration Grants

Districts with more than 55% low income, English learners, or foster youth/homeless receive an additional 50% of the base grant.

MJUSD does not qualify for concentration grants.



Why are we doing this in February?

In the past, California schools were required to report on their performance metrics only once a year through the LCAP. However, the updated LCAP requirements now mandate districts and charter schools (both defined as Local Educational Agencies, or LEAs) to annually provide an LCAP mid-year update presentation to their board, in an effort to ensure that progress towards the goals is continually monitored and evaluated.





Summary of Goals

Broad Goals

- BG1: Expedite student learning and academic growth by providing high-quality teachers, alignment of grade level standards, implementation of academic rigor, and targeted academic intervention/remediation.
- o BG2: Instill a collaborative culture and expand partnership with stakeholders in an effort to provide a safe and welcoming environment that is conducive to student achievement.
- BG3: Expand course offerings, promote career readiness, and provide instruction an dexperience that reinforces core curriculum concepts and skills leading to gainful employment.

Focus Goal

- Decrease chronic absenteeism by 3% for SEL
- Increase ELA and Mathematics scores on the CAASPP by 15 points for SEL

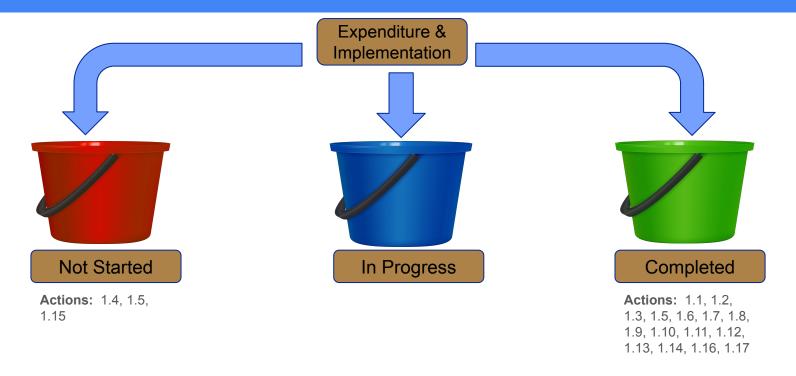

- 2022-2023 Suspension rate 5.8%

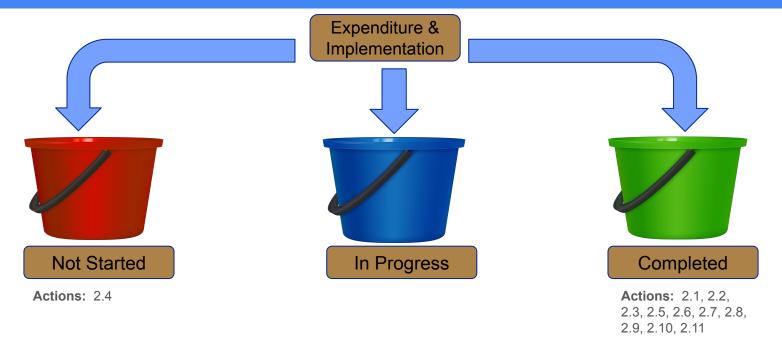

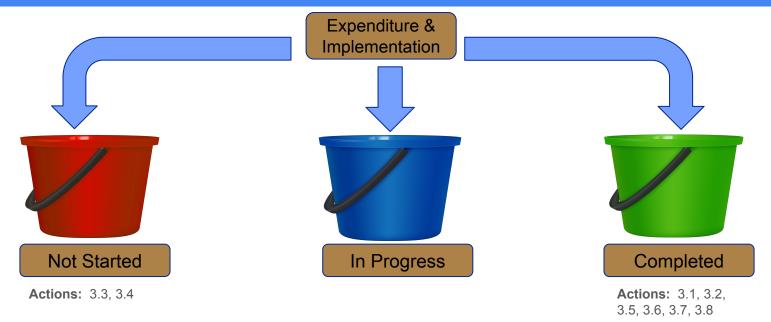
